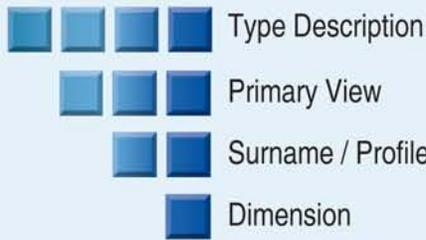

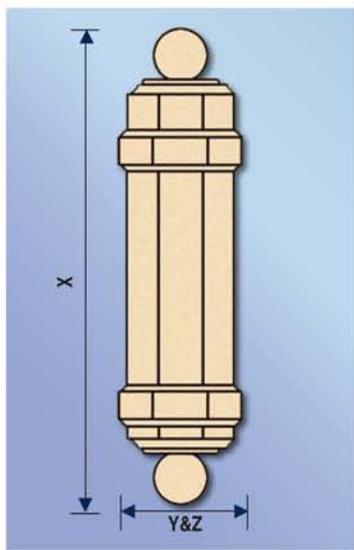

Stone sculptures of the Gods were an important aspect of Aztec religious expression. Statues were placed before altars essential features of every Aztec household and were made to adorn shrines and temples or to be set up in the open air. The sculptures range from the miniature to the monumental in scale. The sculptors worked both in low relief and in the round, and often the two styles are inseparable, as statues commonly included scenes or symbols carved in relief.

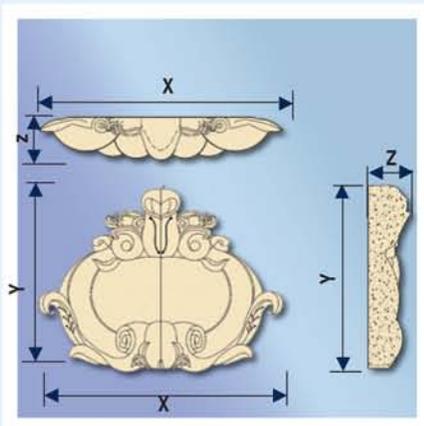

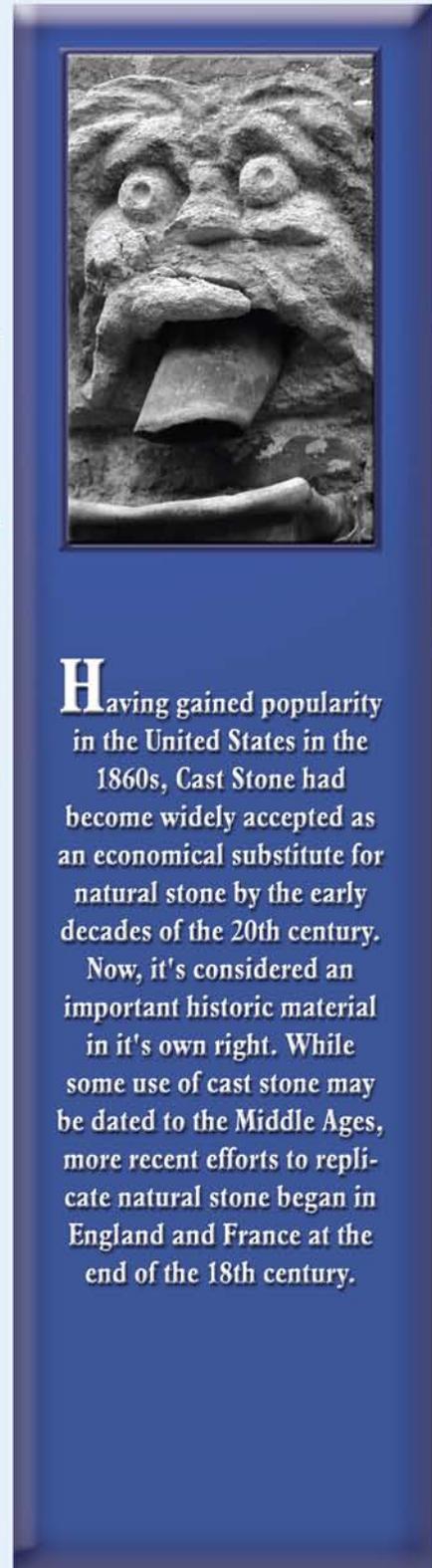

Having gained popularity in the United States in the 1860s, Cast Stone had become widely accepted as an economical substitute for natural stone by the early decades of the 20th century. Now, it's considered an important historic material in it's own right. While some use of cast stone may be dated to the Middle Ages, more recent efforts to replicate natural stone began in England and France at the end of the 18th century.

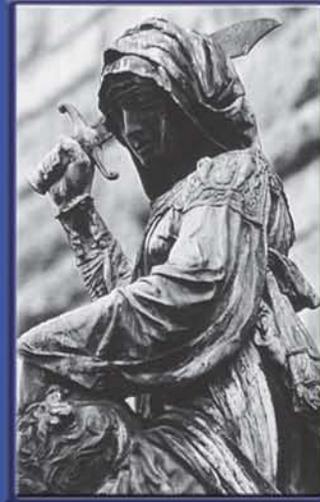

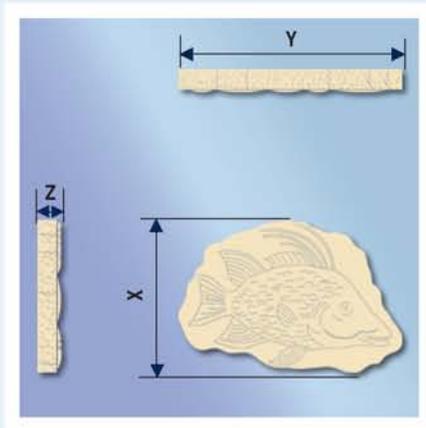

What to specify when ordering Ornaments & Brackets

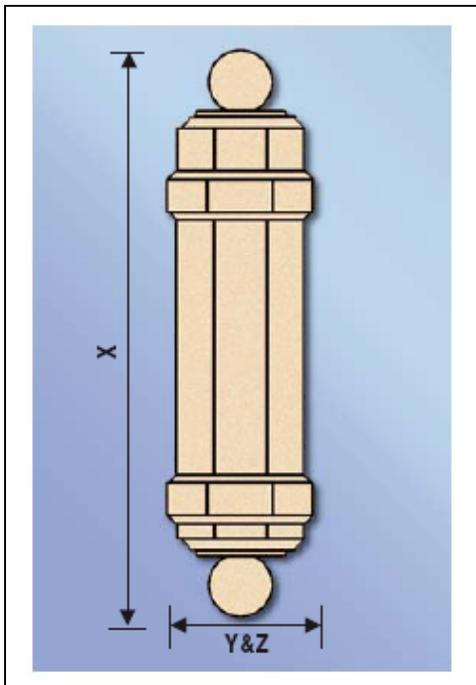
- Verify the Unit Size (Y, Z XX, YY and Radius Dimensions)
- Verify artwork or artist concepts with Photo or Visual aid of Ornament
- Calculate quantity
- Select stone color

- X** Height of a unit. A control dimension.
- Z** Maximum depth of a unit. A control dimension.
- Y** Width of a unit. A control dimension.
- D** Diameter of a unit.
- R** Radius of a unit.
